From the Manse

In a time when so many churches are closing and being put up for sale, one might have cause to assume that interest in the Christian faith and participation in what we do as members of God's church in our community is on the wane. It would, of course, be simply an assumption. We would be the first to agree that we have had plenty challenges to deal with over the past few years, especially in the aftermath of lockdown measures which had to be taken during the Covid epidemic. But it seems to me that the tide is now turning. Our faith in a loving and caring God carried us through difficult days and the belief that God is at work in and through us has inspired us to follow wherever he leads into ventures we may not have been brave enough to consider pre-covid.

In Maud, the fortnightly soup and sweet lunch has gone from strength to strength. It is a delight to walk into a room with so many folk across the ages sharing food and friendship in the fellowship of God's people, ably supported by a team of volunteers without whom the lunch club could not function. If you have not managed along yet, do come when you get the chance. A very warm welcome awaits you. And if you can't manage out, we offer a wee delivery service too (although this is restricted to addresses that are mainly around the village).

In St Kane's, we are adjusting to the Church Centre being our place of worship. Our Session Clerk along with a group of able volunteers has been working around the building, finding suitable places for some of the cherished items we brought over from the church building, and altering various spaces within the centre to make it feel more worshipful. There is a fresh buzz about the place when you step in now, and we have enjoyed the sense of fellowship that can only be found by working together towards a common cause.

Before sitting down to write this letter today, I was reading through the minutes from our most recent Kirk Session meeting and was struck by just how many positive and enjoyable events and experiences we have had as congregations. During the summer we hosted worship in our tent in it's new position at New Deer Show. This is always a joyous occasion. At the end of the school holidays our church family joined together for its annual church picnic which he held in the grounds of Maud Church. The weather was

glorious and much fun was had playing games, blowing bubbles, and of course, sharing food.

Most recently, we enjoyed a wonderful time of worship and fellowship at our Harvest Thanksgiving service which, this year, was in St Kane's. The hall was adorned with seasonal produce and the generosity of our community for the local foodbanks was phenomenal. The highlight for me was sharing in an interactive service of worship in a packed hall, seeing so many folk happy to be gathered in one place to give thanks to God, celebrating his goodness and generosity with whatever gifts we had to offer, including our time and talents. It is a delight to welcome you all, but we have been blessed too by the number of new people coming along and joining the fellowship. God is indeed good.

As for the future, well, watch this space. Mainly Music, a new venture for us, will be starting in January. We are already planning our Christmas services across the two congregations, and an advent bible study group is in the planning for those who might appreciate a quieter moment to reflect on the real meaning of Christmas amid the busy-ness of the seasonal preparations that consume so much of our time and attention.

We hope you can see, not only from this letter but also from the many activities noted in this newsletter, that our churches are nowhere near dying, and that, on the contrary, we have caught our 'second-wind' so to speak and are excited to see what God has in store for us. Do come and join us we you can. As the saying goes, 'come when you can, leave when you must.' But know that a warm welcome awaits you, whether you are a regular visitor, someone who can only make it now and again, or joining in our fellowship for the very first time.

We wish you all the very best of God's blessings for the season that lies ahead and look forward to spending time with you in the days that lie ahead.


